Rapidly, his creativity opened the road to a continuous search expressed with poetry, sculpture, drawing and/or painting.

Several of his works can be seen in the permanent collection of the Musée de Beaune and in many private collections in France, Italie, Belgium, Switzerland, Canada, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, and the United States of America.
